

ATTRACTIONS

Friends of the Dartmoor Hill Pony Display Team choreographs and performs a musical ride of a standard befitting the Household Cavalry! Local children of all ages and abilities ride their Dartmoor Hill Ponies in a complex routine of wheels, reels, cross- overs and tricks, showing what brilliant kiddies' riding ponies our hill Ponies can become. Each year there is a theme with bright costumes, flags, bangs and puffs of smoke which the ponies take in their stride; this year it's "The Circus".

All the ponies "Hillies" are the ponies on the moor, so whatever shape, size or colour we celebrate the distinctness of these ponies by wearing Green and Blue livery, the colours chosen to represent the Dartmoor Hill Ponies. The Hillies running in semi-wild herds on Dartmoor are one unique genetic type, scientifically proven, they are distinct from any other UK breed. They also have five genetic rarities only seen in the few true upland breeds in the UK. These 'adaptive genes' mean they can live and survive in the harshest upland terrain.

Evidence found at archaeological digs in the 1970's show that Hill Ponies have grazed alongside cattle and sheep on Dartmoor since Middle Bronze Age (2000 BC). Millenia of these three species grazing together has created the Dartmoor landscape and habitats where the rare Marsh Fritillary Butterfly, Cirl Bunting and Bog Hoverfly can live. All the ponies grazing on the moor are owned by farmers with grazing rights, thus creating a diverse beautiful productive landscape; man and beast working out a survival strategy which to this day benefits and enriches the flora and fauna of Dartmoor. The skills of wild farming passed from generation to generation over 1000s of years. Come and see us on our stand, we'll be delighted to tell you more.

CAKE RECIPES

MADEIRA CAKE

5oz (125g) margarine A little finely grated lemon rind

5oz (125g) sugar 3 eggs 8oz (200g) self raising flour Milk to mix

1/4 teaspoon salt

Bake for 11/4 hours in a moderate oven

GINGER CAKE

8oz (200g) self raising flour 4oz (100g) soft brown sugar

½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda 4 tablespoons black treacle

2 eggs 2 teaspoons ground ginger

½ teaspoon ground cinnamon

METHOD: Mix all dry ingredients together and sieve, into a basin. In a pan heat butter, milk and treacle, stirring well until melted and combined. Beat eggs into dry ingredients until well mixed and smooth, then beat into treacle mix. Pour mixture into the cake tin and bake for about 45 minutes, when the top springs back when pressed. Cool in tin, turn out and place in an air tight tin for a few days to become moist. 180°C/350°F/gas mark 4.

RULES ADOPTED BY THE SOCIETY

- 1. All exhibits to be staged in the Marquee between 7.00 and 9.00am. Exhibits not in time will be refused. No exhibit to be removed before 5pm.
- 2. No exhibitor should make more than one entry in one class.
- 3. Should the Judges' award equal first prize, the first and second prize shall be divided and no second prize given.
- 4. A Floral Art exhibit is composed of natural plant material with or without accessories contained within a space as specified in the Show Schedule.
- 5. Any Exhibitor infringing the rules will be disqualified and the prize with-held.
- 6. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to anything sent to the Exhibition, or any article in the Marquee.
- 7. The decision of the Committee shall be final in any question arising out of the above rules.

Rules for Homemade Wines, Liqueurs and Cordials

- 1. All wines should have been made by the exhibitor by the process of fermentation. Fortification with spirits is not permitted.
- 2. Bottles should be clear glass of approximately 75cl for wines and cordials and 35cl for liqueurs.

- 3. Corks should be flanged with plastic tops. Plastic stoppers or flush corks should not be used and capsules must not be fitted.
- 4. Wine bottles should not be labelled nor contain any distinguishing marks. Liqueurs and cordials should be labelled. The show organisers will provide cards showing exhibitors' numbers. These should be attached to the bottles by means of a rubber band.
- 5. Bottles should be filled so that when the cork is pushed right home, the air space in the neck of the bottle is between half and one inch in depth.
- 6. Exhibitors may not make more than one entry per class.


